

NEW - SAFER SCHOOLS APP HELPING YOU TO STAY SAFE ONLINE

As part of our goal to ensure that online safety is understood, we have joined the Safer Schools Community as part of our drive to educate students to better protect themselves in the Digital World. We are proud to say that we are now a certified National Online Safety school and have been accredited with this mark for our endeavours in keeping our students and community safe online. You can now download the Safer Schools app for parents onto your smartphone or tablet and link it to Ormiston Sir Stanley Matthews Academy, where you can receive tips and advice on keeping your child safer online.

The parent app aims to support parents with online content, and we have included the instructions on downloading this app on our website. You can find the QR code and the four-digit entry code on the display of the smartphone image on the first page of the guidance. We strongly recommend that you download the app and join our Safer Schools Community so that we can alert you to any new trends or sites that may be of concern or potentially dangerous to children.

We will be introducing the Safer Schools app to students and advising them to download the app onto their smartphones so that they can access the advice and guidance on staying safe online and using social media platforms.

EXAM REVISION HINTS AND TIPS

We are heading into the season of exams, and it is understandably a time when students feel under pressure and stress. Students need to recognise that this is a critical time in their lives, and it does have huge implications for their future. Students will make sacrifices to make sure they do the best they can during this period. At OSSMA, we look to support our students with their exam preparation and ensure that all students have the opportunity to receive support when necessary.

Students often worry about what topics are going to be on the exam paper or that the first exam is a particular subject they are not confident with. It is important for students to acknowledge that they cannot control the uncontrollable. Rather than worrying about things that cannot be controlled, students need to choose how to react to those problems and plan their revision to be better prepared. Students may wish to share their feelings about the pressures of exams. Students often struggle with the feeling of not doing enough, but it is important to take time out to relax. Supporting victims of domestic abuse

Here at OSSMA, we have the opportunity to participate jointly in a project run between schools and Staffordshire Police. Operation Encompass involves the reporting to schools before the start of the next school day when a child or young person has experienced any domestic abuse.

The project will ensure that a member of the school staff (Designated Safeguarding Lead), known as a Key Adult, is trained to liaise with the police and use the information that has been shared in confidence. This allows us as an academy to make provision for possible difficulties experienced by children, or their families, who have experienced a domestic abuse incident.

This exposure negatively impacts children experiencing domestic abuse and can lead to emotional, physical and psychological harm. We are keen to offer the best support possible to all our students, and taking part in Operation Encompass allows us to put vital support in place for the child before they arrive at the academy.

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
