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MEET OUR NEW VICE PRINCIPAL

We are pleased to introduce our new Vice Principal Mrs Kelly Hassall. Mrs Hassall joined us in September and has quickly become part of our OSSMA family. She is responsible for Special Educational Needs, is our Designated Safeguarding Lead (DSL) and is also the academy lead for Welfare and Behaviour. She has a large area of responsibility, but she brings a wealth of experience from different settings, having worked in mainstream academies and also a Pupil Referral Unit (PRU).

Starting her career as a PE teacher (and hockey enthusiast!), Mrs Hassall has experience as a Behaviour Lead and is a skilled SENCO. This experience as a SENCO means that she has extensive knowledge of SEND needs and how it is possible to make the necessary adaptations to support those students to fulfil their potential.

Mrs Hassall said: "My aim for OSSMA is to continue to highlight and safeguard the students and staff. We currently offer fantastic opportunities to our students at the academy, but it is my goal to enrich that experience further to ensure that all our students access the highest quality education possible."

Mrs Hassall has also spent a large part of her career working with students with challenging behaviour and has made it her goal to overcome the barriers to learning that these students may face. She said: "Building good relationships with pupils is key to achieving positive outcomes for them. Personally, I love sports and feel that this teaches valuable lessons and

develops children in aspects that, at times, other curriculum areas cannot.

"I have really enjoyed my time at OSSMA so far, and I lookforward to supporting our students and families to the best of my ability. My aim is that all our students fulfil their potential and have a positive and enriching high school experience."

ATTENDANCE GOALS

Attendance is very important to us at OSSMA. Research shows that students with good school attendance are more likely to achieve higher results in their GCSEs. This means they'll have better options when they leave school and will be more likely to have greater job satisfaction and a higher paid role throughout their working life.

Our vision at OSSMA is for all students to achieve their maximum potential, so naturally, excellent attendance is key to achieving that goal. We hope all of our students attend 100% of the time but understand that this isn't always possible, so our minimum target for all students is 96%. This means having no more than 7.5 days off school for any reason all year.

We can authorise certain absences, and if you have medical evidence, please submit that to our Attendance Officer, Mrs Lisa Shaw, so we can authorise the absence. For any queries or support with pupil attendance please contact Mrs Shaw at the academy.

We will also promote good attendance with our students

and focus on the benefits of regular school attendance in form time in the next couple of weeks until the end of term.

There will be raffles drawn for fortnightly 100% attendance with the chance of winning gift vouchers and certificates, and texts home for those pupils who achieve 100% attendance over the forthcoming weeks.

We are also introducing a weekly attendance trophy for best and also most improved form in each year group, each week, where the form can win form points and the chance to win money for their end-of-term form party on the last day of term on Friday 16th December 2022.

100%	This is everyone's target and is excellent attendance.
96-99%	= 7.5 days or less days of absence in one year.
91-95%	= Between 8 and 18 days of absence in one year.
90% or less	= 19 or more days of absence in one year. Your child is classed as a persistent absentee.

ABBEY HOUSE FARM VISIT
