Could all parents/carers please ensure they park considerately around residents' driveways and access areas and adhere to speed limits?




The girls approached every game with determination to win and played tenaciously while upholding good sportsmanship. They won each game and did not concede a goal, which they were thrilled about.

Each of the 700 students was entered into a draw, and one student from each year group received a Cadbury's Easter Egg. Well done to each and every student who succeeded in our challenge. The Attendance Team would like to thank you for your continued support during the first two terms and we hope you have a restful break over Easter.

Polite reminders:

Punctuality to School - can we please remind parents that students are expected on site by 8.35am in readiness to line up with their form at 8.40am. We are experiencing a higher-than-normal volume of students who are arriving late to the academy so can we request that you discuss with your child if they are arriving late. You will receive a text message on the days students are late, and a letter should the lates persist. If there is no improvement, we will request a meeting with you where further action will be discussed. We appreciate that some days, lateness cannot be helped, but your support with this during the summer term and beyond would be greatly appreciated.

Absences - can we please remind all parents, that any absence from school will be unauthorised unless we receive evidence to support it. Where appointments fall in the school day, we expect students to attend school around these. Again, evidence for those appointments will be required. We work closely with VIP Education and where a student is absent for 3 days without engagement or 4 or more days with engagement, we will request either a home visit or video call, unless a medical professional has seen the student and we have evidence to support that.

Holidays during term time - please be reminded that we cannot authorise any holidays during term time unless they are for exceptional circumstances. Unfortunately, family holidays are not included under that umbrella. If you are thinking of taking your child out of school during term time, please ensure a Leave of Absence form is completed at least four weeks prior, so we are aware of the absence. From September, fines from the Local Authority for unauthorised absences and holidays will increase from £60 to £80, increasing if the fine isn't paid. This has been implemented by the DfE and not the school.

AN ICELANDIC OPPORTUNITY

The Geography Department is proposing a visit to Iceland from 14th to 18th April 2025. The trip is for current Year 9 students, and spaces will be limited to 30. Miss Black will lead the trip, accompanied by members of staff from the Geography Department. The trip has been planned to optimise the once-in-alifetime experiences the country offers.

As Iceland sits on a tectonic plate boundary, our students will have the opportunity to witness several geographical landforms they will study in the classroom during their Geography GCSE course.

The trip will give them a unique insight into geographical landforms

such as amazing volcanoes, waterfalls, lagoons, and landscapes. It will consist of excursions to The Secret Lagoon, Skagafoss Waterfall, Iceland's capital city, Reykjavík, ice caves and glaciers, and a Hellisheidi Geothermal Plant to see how energy is harnessed from underneath the Earth's surface.
