On 1st July, 51 students from OSSMA had the privilege of visiting the Holocaust Memorial Museum in Newark—a deeply moving and educational experience that left a lasting impression on all who attended.

The visit began with The Journey, a powerful exhibition that immersed us in 1930s Berlin through the eyes of a young Jewish boy named Leo. Through his diary, students followed the rise of Nazism, stood in the aftermath of Kristall-nacht, and rode the Kindertransport—gaining a unique and personal insight into the experiences of Jewish children during the Holocaust.

Students then walked through the peaceful and reflective memorial garden, where students laid stones in memory of the 1.5 million children who perished in the Holocaust—an act that allowed for a moment of quiet respect and personal contemplation.

In the museum's main exhibition, students explored the historical timeline of the Holocaust, examining artefacts, testimonies, and multimedia displays that brought to life the devastating impact of prejudice, persecution, and genocide.

A highlight of the day was a truly humbling conversation with Holocaust survivor Stephen Frank. Stephen shared his personal story of growing up in Amsterdam, his family's journey through multiple concentration camps, and his remarkable survival. Our students listened with great sensitivity and asked thoughtful, compassionate questions during a Q&A session that left many deeply moved.

The visit concluded with a seminar on modern-day antisemitism and the lessons we must continue to carry forward from the Holocaust. The session helped students reflect on the importance of remembrance, tolerance, and standing up against hatred in all its forms.

Throughout the day, our students were a credit to the academy—demonstrating maturity, empathy, and a deep engagement with the subject matter. Staff at the museum commented on their exemplary behaviour and insightful contributions.

This was more than just a school trip—it was an experience that will stay with our students for years to come. They return not only with a deeper understanding of the past but also with a stronger sense of responsibility for the future.

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Summer term and whole year rewards will be issued in the final week of the term.

Polite reminder - holidays during term time are unlikely to be authorised unless they are for extenuating circumstances and this may result in a fine from the Local Authority (currently £80 per adult, per child). Should you receive a penalty notice, then the next holiday in term time will automatically be declined regardless of the reason, and the Penalty Notice then increases to £160 per adult, per child.

A third holiday within a three-year period will, unfortunately, result in an immediate referral and this automatically gets heard at Court, where fines around £1000 will be issued per parent per child. Please note, this is a directive from the Department for Education and the academy has to implement the rules. Once the Penalty Notice has been submitted to the Local Authority, it cannot be withdrawn, therefore it is essential that any in-term holidays are notified to the school, via a Leave of Absence form (available from reception) with a minimum of 4 weeks' notice.

This is so we are able to review your request and send a response out in a timely manner. Holidays in term time, taken without submission of a Leave of Absence form will automatically be declined and referred to the Local Authority.

BUTTON BATTERY SAFETY



Button batteries are small, round, silver-coloured batteries that come in many different sizes and types. They power many of our devices to make our lives more convenient.

Most button batteries pass through the body without a problem. But if a lithium coin cell battery gets stuck in the food pipe, energy from the battery reacts with saliva to create caustic soda. This is the chemical used to unblock drains!

This can burn through the food pipe, to the main artery and lead to catastrophic internal bleeding and death. The chemical reaction can happen in as little as two hours. However, sometimes it takes days or even weeks.

Lithium coin cell batteries can also cause life-changing injuries. There is a risk that the food pipe is too badly damaged for a child to eat normally again or the vocal cords are too badly damaged for a child to speak normally again. For further advice follow this link http://bit.ly/4lc194N
