Amazing Athletics Achievements

Alfie R in Year 9 has achieved an outstanding milestone—he is now the English Schools Champion and officially ranked number 1 in the UK for Junior Boys Hammer!

Being selected to represent Staffordshire at the English Schools Athletics Championships—competing against 48 counties—was already an honour. But to go on and win the entire event by an impressive margin of 5 metres, with a throw of 54.40m, is nothing short of phenomenal.

This is one of the most prestigious national competitions for young athletes, and winning it is an extraordinary accomplishment. This season Alfie has competed multiple times and is currently:

- Regional Champion in Discus
- 2nd Place in Regional Javelin Championships
- Achieved English Schools qualifying standards in Javelin, Discus, and Hammer
- Achieved National Standard in Hammer
- Ranked Number 1 in the UK in Hammer
- English Schools Champion in Junior Boys Hammer.

Alfie's commitment, determination, and relentless drive to improve himself are truly inspiring.

Out of the entire Staffordshire team, only two medals were awarded one was to Alfie, who took gold in the Hammer. A huge well done!

Other outstanding athletes include Jaime Leigh R Year 7 and Aaron R in Year 9 who are both City Champions for High Jump. Well done!

A big chunk of the day has been spent at Jorvik centre. Students were able to see the replica Coppergate dig and could see the outline of the Viking settlement. They then had the opportunity to look around a replica Viking settlement and could experience the sights, sounds and smells!

The highlight of the day for students was in the museum exhibition where among the skeletons, swords, and axe heads was the worlds largest excavated poo- which even the King has held!

All in all, our visit to the Jorvik Viking Centre and DIG was a resounding success. The students returned with a deeper understanding of Viking history and a newfound appreciation for the work of archaeologists. We're already looking forward to our next adventure.







UNIFORM UPDATE FOR SEPTEMBER 2025

Many thanks for your support this academic year in ensuring that our students are adhering to the high standards of uniform at OSSMA.

We are delighted to see so many of our students consistently following the uniform policy, which we believe fosters a positive school culture, image and creates a positive learning environment for all.

Your efforts in ensuring that your child is in the correct uniform every day plays a key role in maintaining these high standards and we as an academy appreciate it greatly.

There are a few key changes to the uniform policy from September 2025 which we have gone through with the students in assemblies, form time and in PE lessons. These include the change to our school skirt which must be 20 inches in length, black and pleated. The pleated skirts are available at most school retailers including School's In which is located at 41 Weston Road in Meir.

We would also like to provide an important update regarding our uniform for PE lessons. Students can wear black jogging bottoms, shorts or leggings, that must be plain black with no lines, branding, or logos.

However, from September, please ensure that PE shorts are mid-thigh length unisex sports shorts as pictured in our uniform guidance and opposite. Cycling shorts or Nike Pro shorts of any length are not permitted. Suitable unisex sports shorts are widely available from major retailers, including Amazon, Matalan, and M&S.
